Titan Electric completed an extensive build out for Loyola University at its Norville Center for Intercollegiate Athletics in Chicago.

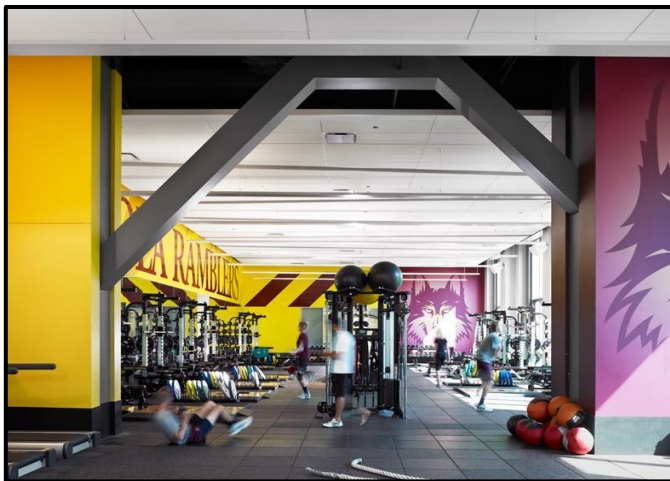
Serving as the new home for Loyola Athletics, the Center is the first of a five-phased, five-year reimagine building campaign on Loyola's Lake Shore Campus. The overall \$100 million investment promises to vastly improve the student experience on campus in a number of ways.

The three-story, 77,000 square foot facility complex includes fully furnished locker rooms, state-of-the-art strength and conditioning equipment, a Loyola athletics Wall of Fame, a sports medicine facility, a student-athlete academic center and other facilities that will transform the on-campus experience of all students and help take Loyola's athletics to the next level.

The Center would never have happened without the generous support of Alfie and Allan Norville (BS '60, trustee). Allan is a member of Loyola's Board of Trustees, co-chair of the Athletics Leadership Committee and a former Loyola star basketball player.

As a base building with a complete build-out, Titan was required to keep the existing arena operational during construction of the new center. Titan's involvement included installation of a Lutron Quantum System with load shed monitoring, BAC net control and graphics. A new 1200 amp feed from ComEd was also installed.

Power Construction was the general contractor for the project with architectural services provided by Solomon Cordwell Buenz.
